





2.	Assume reasonably good equitation at the:  a. walk  b. trot or jog  c. canter or lope (3)		
3.	Canter both directions of an arena and be able to recognize the correct leads for both directions. (3)		
4.	Move from a walk to a canter or lope and from a canter or lope to a walk. (2)		
5.	Move from a trot or jog to a canter or lope and from a canter or lope to a trot or jog. (2)		
6.	Move from a halt to a trot or jog and from a trot or jog to a halt. (2)		
7.	At a trot, reverse to the right, reverse to the left. (2)		
8.	Using proper aids, back up four steps, then halt for five seconds, then walk forward. (2)		
9.	Stand still for 10 seconds. (1)		
10.	Execute a figure eight at the trot or jog, changing diagonals if necessary. (1)
